Would you like free, practical support to improve your grazing business while doing your bit for the Great Barrier Reef?

The Reef Alliance Project, through the Australian Government Reef Trust Programme, is offering graziers located within the Burnett priority area the opportunity to receive training and extension services to help improve grazing management practices that will reduce sediment runoff into the Great Barrier Reef lagoon.



If you can answer **YES** to **ALL** the following questions you may be eligible to participate in the Reef Alliance Project – Burnett Grazing

- Is your property located in the Burnett Priority Area? (see map overleaf)**
The priority area is the subcatchment encompassing Paradise Dam to Walla Weir.
- Have you completed, or are you willing to complete, the Grazing BMP?**
A Grazing BMP workshop may be held locally where you can complete the Grazing BMP over 2 days; alternatively Grazing BMP can be completed online @ www.bmpgrazing.com.au.
- Would you like to feel more confident that your pasture, land and herd management decisions result in improved land condition & productivity?**
- Are you concerned about low ground cover levels, gully erosion, streambank erosion and/or soil movement off your property?**
- Is the grazing area on your property greater than 40 ha (100 ac)?**
- Would you like to develop and implement a property improvement plan with support from a designated extension officer?***

**Participants will receive individual, tailored support until mid 2019, from the Reef Alliance Grazing Extension Officer to implement a Property Improvement Plan (PIP) focusing on grazing, land and herd management practices for improved land condition (especially practices that reduce soil loss). The Plan will be developed by the landholder and the Reef Alliance Grazing Extension Officer and technical assistance and training to help implement the Plan will be provided free-of-charge.*

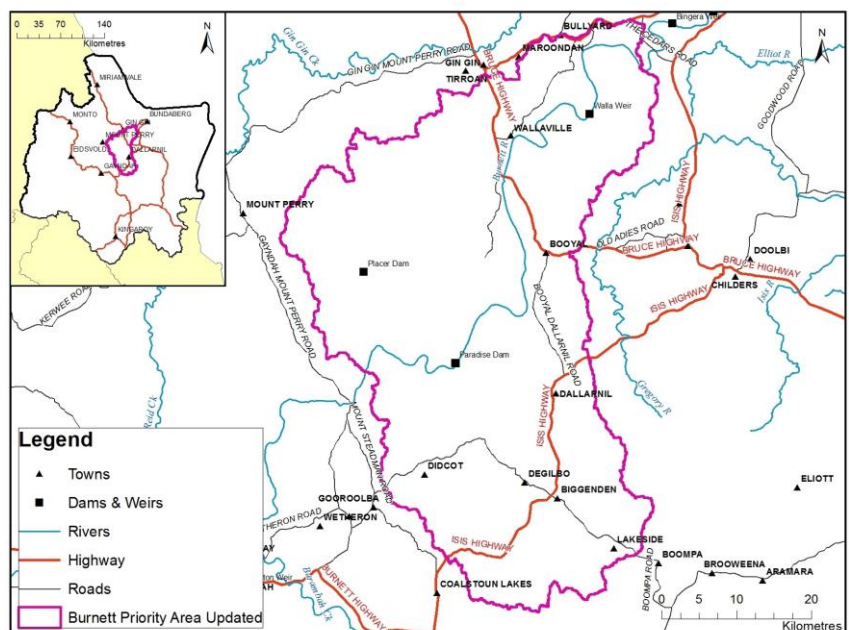
